3) Business

a. Appropriation Bills

i. Appropriation #2F – Radical Feminist Literary Society

1. Chair entertains a motion to open Appropriation 2F
 - a. Motion seconded and passed.
2. RFLS: My name is Emma Harrison, and I am here on behalf of our chair, Vivenne Norman. We are requesting 500 dollars for this semester to purchase two books for our 30 members to read. We will be storing them in our faculty advisor Ann Murphy's office.
3. Sen. Alarcon: How long does it take you guys to read a whole book?
4. Harrison: We try to split it evenly between the semester, but we may not read every page
5. Sen. Wyatt: What process did you guys use to find the best deals on books?
6. Harrison: Honestly, I'm not sure, the chair of the club was involved in that process.
7. Sen. Wyatt:
8. Sen. Ramsell: Will the books be exclusively on campus?
9. Harrison: We'll give them to students for the period we're reading them, and when we're not reading them, they will be stored in the office
10. Sen. Carillo: Have you had any general meetings this semester?
11. Harrison: No.
12. Sen. Carillo: What do the general meetings look like?
13. Harrison: We meet in the SUB (Student Union Building) every week to go over the assigned reading, the chair has questions for everyone, then we move into a more open discussion format. They usually last an hour to an hour and a half.
14. Sen. Carillo: Would it be possible for the books to be kept on campus until you check them out?
15. Harrison: Yes, they will be staying in the office when students are not using them, and I think it would be very reasonable to institute a checkout policy or create a separate reading time for us to do it all together.
16. Sen. Carillo: Thank you, full senate is next week at 6 o'clock; you will get the money before the end of the semester.

ii. Appropriation #3F – UNM E-Sports

1. Chair entertains a motion to open Appropriation 3F
 - a. Motion seconded and passed.
2. Dylan Boman: The two core things we are focusing on are a better emphasis on our production value and equipment and teams we supervise if they need event money and things like that. The biggest things to eye are better cameras and camera equipment: cages, green screens, tripods, keeping our



production value up for events. For team-related costs, they are baseline costs for our teams with the highest potential and their tournaments. Our Call of Duty team is ranked 32nd in the nation—we do not want them to worry about event fees. So, to recap; higher production quality,

3. Sen. Pereira: You do have graduate students, have you requested money from GPSA?
4. Charles: We missed the deadline for GPSA. I came in just recently, we are planning to go to them at the beginning of the spring semester, when they take appropriations.
5. Sen. Romero-Salas: What exactly did you want to do with the streaming equipment? To get your names out there?
6. Boman: It is to raise our production value for when we host events here on campus and streaming for tournaments. They would be in our space on campus: we run everything for esports in the entire space.
7. Charles: Right now, we are in talks with RTI, a company that does computer networking, we are working with them for our events, including one with xfinity and UC Berkeley. We want to make sure our production value is up there with the big companies approaching us.
8. Sen. Romero-Salas: How detrimental would it be to fund two or one cameras?
9. Boman: A lot of our line items are on a case-by-case basis. We don't need two audio mixers—that is okay to cut it in half. Event fees are also okay to go down on.
10. Sen. Romero-Salas: What does funding look like beyond ASUNM?
11. Charles: We hold some events at our space that generate money, we have other revenue streams, this is just to ensure that these events succeed.
12. Boman: Our next line of weeklies, and other events we host and separate fundraising help us rely less and less on ASUNM.
13. Sen. Romero-Salas: As a student, how much money do I personally have to put into the organization?
14. Boman: For something like Smash or COD—it behooves you to buy the controller as well as the game, which is an over a hundred-dollar investment. The student would pay over a hundred dollars, if they already have a PC, for PC games. For league of legends for example, that would be more.
15. Charles: We currently do not have dues in our organization, which is something we are talking about instituting this semester.
16. Sen. Romero-Salas: Thank you so much for answering all my questions
17. Sen. Ramsell: Do you have a location to store all this equipment?
18. Boman: We currently have the north side of the physics-engineering pod. We have a locked back room where everything high value goes.
19. Sen. Martin: Are event fees for when you go to other schools?
20. Boman: Yes, so it is when we go to those outside events, ensuring our players do not have to pay very much out of pocket to attend these events.
21. Sen. Martin: Is your member count based on your discord, general meetings?
22. Boman: About 120 members.
23. Sen. Wyatt: Are most of your events in Albuquerque?



24. Charles: These are in ABQ and online. So those event fees would go to travel and fees.
25. Sen. Wyatt: So, do you normally travel for events?
26. Charles: No, most of our events we can join online from our space on campus.
27. Sen. Wyatt: If you travelled to an event space, would you be taking the equipment in this appropriation over there?
28. Boman: Out of state, at most we would bring the cameras and mics at most.
29. Charles: Whenever we have brought things off campus, it is under the eye of the production team the entire time, inventoried before and after.
30. Sen. Carillo: I talked to Angela, because they are bringing the cameras back, we don't have to worry too much about the cameras. I see you guys are hosting a conference
31. Boman: NMEC—that is us inviting every upper education esports team to our space and we host a day-long tournament from 9-9.
32. Charles: We are also hosting the xfinity event in the SUB ballroom from October 14th to 15th.

44. Sen. Carillo: Full senate is next Wednesday at 6 o'clock if you want to come watch us deliberate over your appropriation, it's very cool if you guys show up. Thank you so much.

45. Sen. Carillo: Appropriation 3F passes at 6990.15. Thank you, Vice President Pacheco.

iii. Appropriation #4F – World Affairs Delegation

1. Chair entertains a motion to open Appropriation 4F

a. Motion seconded and passed.

2. Shaleena: What we focus on is building academic skills, such as research writing and public speaking. We accept every member, and we work with high school and middle school students. We are the only MUN school who hosts conferences for them.

3. Jasmine: We host Lobo MUN and NMMUN.

4. Shaleena: We also work with the international studies institute to bring in an international speaker. There is Trojan MUN in LA, we are bringing 30 members. UNCMUN, World MUN; we choose our best delegates.

5. Jasmine: ASUNM usually only accounts for 1/3 of our actual budget. We do bake sales and we charge conference fees for those we host.

6. Shaleena: We use ASUNM and UNM scholarships to run our club, which amounts to about 30k a year. The only thing we ask members to pay for is travel fees for if they get accepted to conferences.

7. Jasmine: We have our finances from last year printed out. We typically make over ten thousand dollars in fundraising each year.

8. Shaleena: Based on the student fee, we raise that from 8k to 12k. We go to the most prestigious conference in the country. We are one of the few teams in the US that attends World MUN in Paris. We have delegates who have won at that conference in the past. We don't ask for very much when it comes to operating expenses—it's just to make travel more accessible for our members. The World MUN money is due now, all our expenses are due towards the beginning of the semester.

9. Sen. Romero-Salas: If there were to be any cuts, which conference is the most important?

10. Shaleena: World MUN. It is the most prestigious, everyone looks forward to it, it is the best one.

11. Jasmine: There are also specific scholarships given to World MUN, so if it were cut it would be money unused.

12. Sen. Wyatt: How do you calculate your member count?

13. Shaleena: We count active members as those who have attended two meetings. We have 35 returning members from last semester.

14. Sen. Wyatt: World MUN has been cancelled a few times in the past, how will you mitigate the risk of that?

15. Shaleena: It's out of our hands, but the money will be refunded if the conference is cancelled.

16. Sen. Romero-Salas: How many people are you planning to take to world MUN?



17. Shaleena: World MUN is a max of 14 people.
18. Sen. Carillo: What are the benefits of going to an international conference versus a domestic one?
19. Shaleena: The conferences are all structured the same, but it is the most competitive and most difficult. We are one of the only clubs that goes international for competitions on campus. It's the biggest and most important conference in Model UN.
20. Sen. Carillo: Would you have an alternative conference to go to if World MUN is cancelled?
21. Shaleena: Yes, there is one in Canada and that would be our replacement.
22. Sen. Carillo: I know World MUN is around spring break. Would it be detrimental to your student organization if you requested it in the spring?
23. Shaleena: Yes, the fees for World MUN are due now and we must book flights, nothing is due in the spring for the conference.
24. Jasmine: Typically, everything is in one appropriation.
25. Sen. Alarcon: IF there were cuts to be made, what would you be okay with?
26. Shaleena: Yes, the Ubers and metro tickets, and food. We can mitigate those the best.
27. Sen. Romero-Salas: What are your fundraising estimates for the year?
28. Jasmine: Last year, the bake sales generated around 479 dollars, the conference generated 6000, other fundraising generated 1000, the total was around 10k last year. Our fundraising is also better in the spring than in the fall.
29. Sen. Wyatt: We only have about 100,000 dollars this semester and you only have 35 members, can you justify why 16,000 dollars should go to you?
30. Shaleena: Those 35 members contribute a lot to this college campus and have an impact on the local high school and middle schoolers. That's my argument.
31. Sen. Carillo: What's your availability for more local conferences?
32. Shaleena: There are some, but we have never been to them, we don't know what they are like, and the price is comparable to the farther conferences. The trip to Trojan MUN is cheaper than a closer one. The closer ones do not cut very many costs.
33. Jasmine: There is also no statewide hosted conference for collegiate level MUN.
34. Discussion
35. Sen. Wyatt: What seems like is most important to me is the travel cost, we can bring that down to cover 50 or 60 percent of a plane ticket instead of funding it at 70 percent.
36. Sen. Pereira: Yes, I agree with Senator Wyatt.
37. Sen. Romero-Salas: I feel as if some of this funding can be given later in the year, something I'm really concerned about for World MUN last year is that it was cancelled and was cancelled the past two years. There is no guarantee that it would happen. As a member of the club, I would suffer the detriments of that, but I feel the same way about UNC MUN.



38. Sen. Carillo: This semester specifically there is a rule to request two appropriations. This expires December 1st. You can request another appropriation later in the cycle.
39. Sen. Martin: Another thing we can reduce is the cost of Ubers and food, which reduces it a bit. World MUN seems it must be funded now, or they cannot go. Realistically I do not think we should look at potential cancellation as a reason not to fund World MUN.
40. Sen. Wyatt: When is the deadline to pay for World MUN?
41. Shaleena: November
42. Sen. Wyatt: They could apply for another appropriation
43. Sen. Carillo: Right, but the appropriation funds may not kick in until after they need to register and pay for World MUN.
44. Sen. Pereira: Correct me if I'm wrong, but the 100,000 dollars doesn't replenish until the spring, wouldn't that add up to the same amount anyways?
45. Sen. Carillo: The purpose of a second appropriation is to give leeway to other student organizations requesting appropriations. The difficulty here is such a small student organization requesting so much money. This allows other student organizations to come through.
46. Sen. Wyatt: Yes, that sums up the argument well. We have a lot of student organizations
47. Sen. Romero-Salas: How would budget revision look if World MUN is cancelled?
48. Sen. Carillo: It will go in by category, they can spend it how they would like to, but it is important for us to know what events they plan on.
49. Sen. Romero-Salas: The proportion between the 16,000 dollars and 35 people is something to consider. I want to know peoples' thoughts on that.
