i. Rosa Isela Cervantes:

"Thank you so much for having me here today!"

- Director of El Centro de la Raza
 Created in 1969, by students for students model.
 Ms. Rosa Isela Cervantes went into detail about the history of El Centro.
- Over 10,000 students identify as Hispanic/Latino or Chicano nearly 43% of the Lobo Population. El Centro is about all students succeeding. It's all about "what you need " is the general theme of El Centro.



Thursday 9/26 - Pre Red Rally Social being hosted by all three ethnic centers. El Centro has an open door policy. Get involved!

SEN. CASAUS - When are "Cafecitos con Rosa" and other events that we can tell students about? What demographic do the "Transformar" program adhere to?

ROSA ISELA CERVANTES - Cafecitos happen during certain times and they usually fluctuate depending on our events. Follow our socials so receive updates and complete dates. The Transformar program usually applies to Freshman and Sophomore students to talk and explore culture. Offers many opportunities and is open for all. Accessible geographically.

SEN ZINSMEYER - How has El Centros Mission changed with the coming of many new students, a growing campus, and many first gen students?

ROSA ISELA CERVANTES - Well we have a tight connection with our students and we ask their needs and wants. We have utilized data from surveys we have given to adapt and launch pilot programs for some graduate students. Larger systematic university conversations is the goal. We've also added staff to our team to collect data and do things that students need and want. We want to raise 50,000 dollars during Hispanic Heritage Month.

SEN GONZALES - With the symposium and the hispanic population at UNM, how can the senate and the undergraduate program within ASUNM contribute to your organization?

ROSA ISELA CERVANTES - I believe that just having the conversation is a great place to start. Part of it is having that conversation about the demographics of New Mexico and being informed and doing research and understanding who our org effects. Think about UNM and our goals. We want to enroll, retain, and graduate them. We believe that it's so much more than that. How do we invest in who we are serving and in what ways? Imagine a professor centered you and your teaching styles



and your culture in the curriculum. Would you not learn better that way? So what I want from you, the senate, is to consider all of a student's angles and what they truly need vs what you can give them.

SEN RUTHERFORD - What does service look like to you and how can senators actually serve?

ROSA ISELA CERVANTES - I believe that it's about your intentions and stopping when it's not working. It takes more time to include everyone at the table and it's really about putting in the hard work. I spend a lot of time building consensus with my staff, although it's tedious and takes more time but it's more fruitful to hear all voices in an inclusive space. Be intentional with your conversations from day one. We want to hear from students and even staff. How can you connect to your community? This single symposium we've sent over 1000 emails personalized and gives people opportunities to connect with us more personally.

SEN HILANG - What sources does El Centro receive most of your input from?

ROSA ISELA CERVANTES - We get it from all over. Surveys are a great tool but we utilize many different forms of conversations to students. We ask during cafecitos and other events we are able to put on. We also reach out to friends and colleges across the nation and that's how we came together. Students talking about what needs to happen and how we are able to get that down.

SEN HILANG - For events like the symposium, how can people find volunteer opportunities?

ROSA ISELA CERVANTES - EMAIL US! We love to talk to students and get you involved by forwarding your email to wherever they can best help. We love it when you show up and help.



SEN ROMERO - Do you have any events strictly in Spanish?

ROSA ISELA CERVANTES - No events currently, strictly spanish we tend to focus on Bi lingual conversation.

Promoting student wellbeing events and conducting an assessment to get a good response rate of what students need and we need ASUNM to take the assessment. We opted for an 8 minute survey. Andrew Norton EXEC DIRECTOR OF ASUNM SSE:

Silent Light Nights was a huge success for our agency. I want to read you all our ASUNM mission statement and explain why SSE is accomplishing that fully. The money you've given us so far has gone to collaborations with resource centers, unm food, and legislators that come to visit UNM. SSE Staff has been present at all ASUNM events and were requesting 75,000\$. Yes that is a lot of money but let me explain why we need it. We have so many new and growing lobos that want to attend our events and



need more space, funds, and resources to accommodate all these students. We're requesting 37,000\$ for a headliner for Fiestas. We want you all to help us bring bigger artists to our campus. Do you want to be the people who bring bigger celebrities to our campus? We have also requested money for speakers for students to come enjoy and see. We've also requested an extra 15,000\$ for that fund. Our events have consistently seen the most attendance from past years.

SEN ROMERO: Why is this Org requesting airfare and per diem gas mileage and the personal table cloth, does it violate any laws in rules! SEN RUTHERFORD: Since the Organization is sending 16 students so their idea was if they could get the funding they would but since we're funding only 10 flights, we will fund the two vehicles to drive the rest of the students to get there. In regards to their professional service, it was submitted and SGAO has deemed it not the case since it is tailored to their organization. SGAO approved their audit.

SEN WARD: Provided clarification on the Anti Donation laws.

SEN HILANG: Clarifications of standing rules for the finance committee? SEN RUTHERFORD: Finance Committee is held to standing rules for trips at 7500\$. It discourages killing two birds with one stone. Cutting their per diem helped.
