 - viii. Andrew: Yes.
 - ix. Sen. Bennett: Are there chapter fees associated with your fraternity that could contribute to self-generated funds?
 - x. Andrew: We do not have fees, but we do fundraise to try and cover most of the cost. We have sold shirts in theme with our pickleball tournament in March which is another fundraising event.

 - ii. Giovanni: We have 33 members currently. We are an old organization and have many accolades. We received funding last semester for a conference that was cancelled and received money for a maker's space instead. The equipment we purchased was invaluable. We are reaching out now for two events, a competition and conference. The last five line items are for the conference. So far, we have raised 3500 dollars for the competition as well as travel funds. Our design teams have chosen these items and cannot build a bike and participate in the competition without these. Our members voted this conference the most important event of the year, 16 members will be attending. The advance registration ends on May 25. We included both airfare and a rental van for you to pick from. Our competition team has 26 of our 33 members.
 - iii. Sen. Schultz: If you could go through the categories on the first page, could you tell us which you prioritize?
 - iv. Giovanni: The first is an electric motor. We are making a bicycle with a large shell. This is one of the most important aspects to get right. The second line item is a battery for that motor, the third is a structural component. We inherited a structure from another design team at UNM that we need to modify and use for this competition. The structure right now is only a base with wheels. The acrylic sheets allow for 360-degree view. The harness is required for safety. We need tubing and structural components, a heat gun, resin, fiberglass cloth, a system component, a chain tensioner, fiberglass



- tape, and those are all the HPVC listed items. We plan to secure unlisted items from sponsors.
- v. Sen. Montoya: Who are your sponsors?
 - vi. Giovanni: Intel has given us 2000 dollars for a computer to simulate the bike. We received 1000 dollars from the school of engineering's dean's office. We got 500 from the department. And the UNM bike shop has given us some structural components. We have 282 dollars in our self-generated funds.
 - vii. Sen. Avilucea: This is the Virginia competition?
 - viii. Giovanni: Yes, on April 19th.
 - ix. Sen. Wright: Is the van a 16-person van?
 - x. Giovanni: Yes, it is cheaper than two vehicles to rent.
 - xi. Sen. Montoya: How are you transporting the bike?
 - xii. Giovanni: We are planning to rent a U-Haul trailer.
